

1. A seminar on “Career options after GRADUATION” was organized by the Career Guidance and Placement Cell in collaboration with T.I.M.E. (Thruimphant Institute of management Education) on 23rd Feb 2023. T.I.M.E. is an institute which offers entrance coaching for CAT, GATE, IMP, CLAT, BBA, Bank PO, SSC, CGL etc. The speakers were Mr. Soumen Das (B. Tech, IITG, MBA, IIML) and Mr. Dinesh Lahoti (B. Tech, IITG).



2. Workshop: Campus to Corporate. An initiative by Advancing North East. Workshop organized by IQAC and Career guidance cell, HGC in collaboration with NEDFI on 14th March 2023. About more than 100 students participated in the workshop. Ms. Chandni Shivam, consultant, physical outreach and youth engagement, ANE, NEDFI and Ms. Nishie Agarwal Corporate Trainee, Learning and Development Specialist were the resource persons.



3. Talk on Women entrepreneurship was organized by IQAC and Career Guidance cell, HGC in collaboration with NEDFI, Assam. The speaker was Sri Rajiv Khaidem, NEDFI, Assam on 21st March 2023.
4. On 28.03.2023 the college adopted Bor Amudpur village situated near Bhagabatipara (Rampur) and a Memorandum of Understanding was signed to work for next 5 years. There are around 64 families in the village. Earlier most of the families engaged in agriculture, but now a day many of them are associated with small local businesses and few of them are also in service. Most women are housewives and many of them are experts in weaving. They are also interested in tailoring, but do not have proper facilities like tailoring machines. There is only one Lower Primary School, but recently due to less number of students, the school has been merged with a neighbouring school. The village does not have library, but there is one community hall and one Anganbadi Kendra.



5. A Teacher Exchange programme under MOU was organized by the department of History on 29/3/2023. The session titled Oral Culture and Oral History. Dr. Ditemoni Baruah provided valuable insights into the significance of oral history in preserving cultural heritage, highlighting how oral narratives contribute to understanding the socio-cultural fabric of communities.



6. Jintu Thakuria, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, HGC taken a class on Historical Research and Ex Post Facto Research to the PG 2nd Semester Students of Department of Education, Cotton University on 13/05/2024.



7. Panel discussion with Members and Entrepreneurs of North East on 24th April 2023. 8. The College also signed an agreement with FICCI FLO, a division of the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (**FICCI**) for the cause of development of the village. With the help of it the college donated two sewing machines to the village on 7.8.2023.

Moreover, the college the college also donated one computer set and yarn for loom to the villagers of our adopted village Bor Amudpur. Principal Dr. Ranjit Sarma and IQAC Coordinator Dr. Pori Hiloidari handed over those items to the residents of the village in the college campus. It was decided that an instructor would be given the responsibility to teach tailoring to the village women for three months. The instructor was given remuneration by the FICCI on behalf of the college.





9. An interactive session with the team of Takshashila School of Civil Services was organized by Career Guidance and Placement Cell, HGC, on 26th August 2023 to discuss and generate awareness among the students about various options through Civil Services. 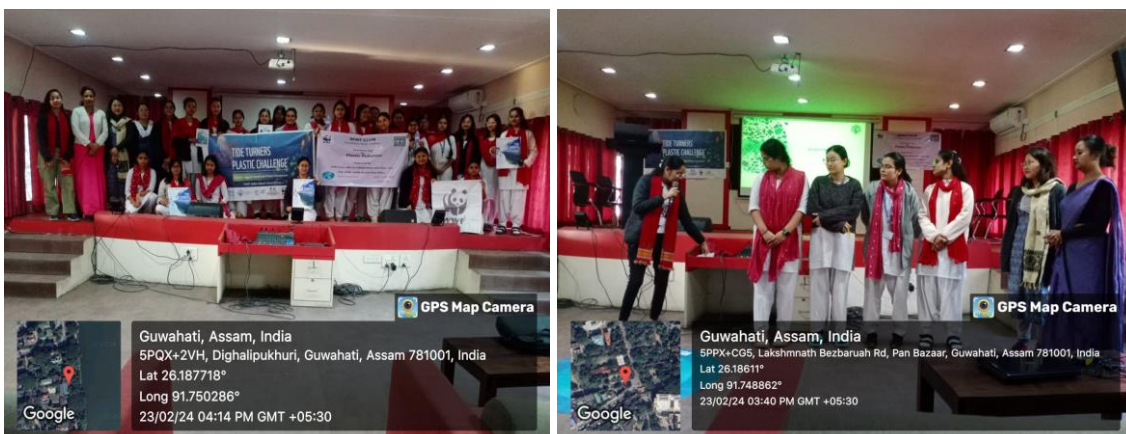

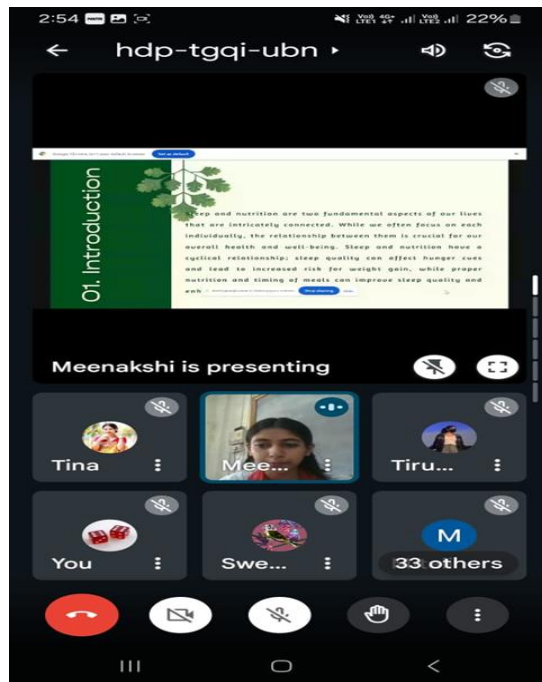
